The YW's **Child Enrichment Programs** serve 260 youngsters from 6 months to 12 years at three centers.

The **Sports and Fitness Department** houses a racquetball court, gymnasium and full fitness center with sauna, cardio equipment, free weights and Nautilus equipment. Certified and experienced instructors teach group exercise and cycle classes while personal trainers focus on individual fitness needs.

The YW also houses the **only indoor pool in Adams County** that is open to the public. It allows people to swim, participate in our Sharks swim team, take water fitness classes, and enjoy the water with their children. The YW's natatorium also houses a whirlpool.

"Road Scholar Adventures in Lifelong Learning," helps visitors discover the history of Gettysburg and the American Civil War.

Community outreach programs bring in experts to teach a wide variety of topics including gardening, bird watching, and healthy eating.

The **Hallmark and Mission Department** reaches out into the community to teach people of all ages the importance of equality and value of learning about other cultures through its Time to Talk series, cultural celebration events, brown bag lunches, and Women's Economic Empowerment seminars.
